SCHOLARSHIP

A new Scholarship season is upon us. The programs of the Elks National Foundation (ENF) and the Arizona Elks Association (AEA) are being directed to the schools with the appropriate populations.

The program that needs the most reinforcing is the ENF "Legacy" program. It is available to Children, Grandchildren, Step-Children, and Grand Step-Children of Elk members in good standing for two or more years. The benefits of a successful application will result in an award of \$1,000 for four years for a total of \$4,000. The applicants must be high school seniors on track to graduate at the end of this academic year. They may reside anywhere in the U. S. A. The applications for the Legacy are only available on-line at www.elks.org/enf/scholars. Also, an applicant who is eligible for the Legacy is also eligible for the Most Valuable Student (MVS) award. They should apply for both. The application for the MVS is also available at the same website.

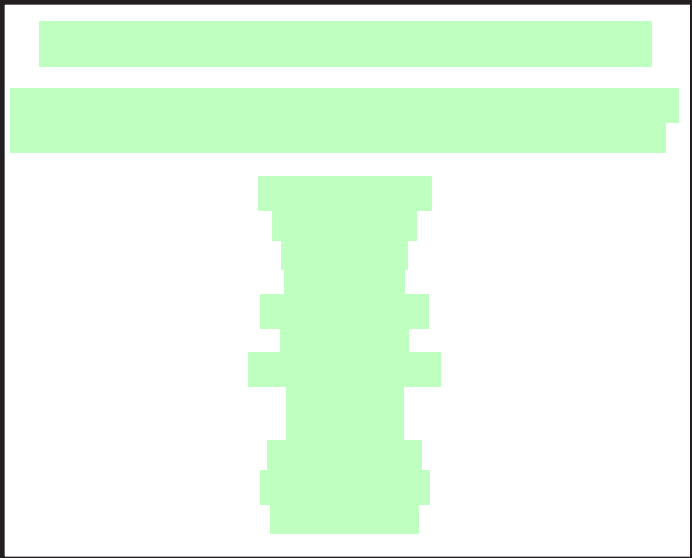
