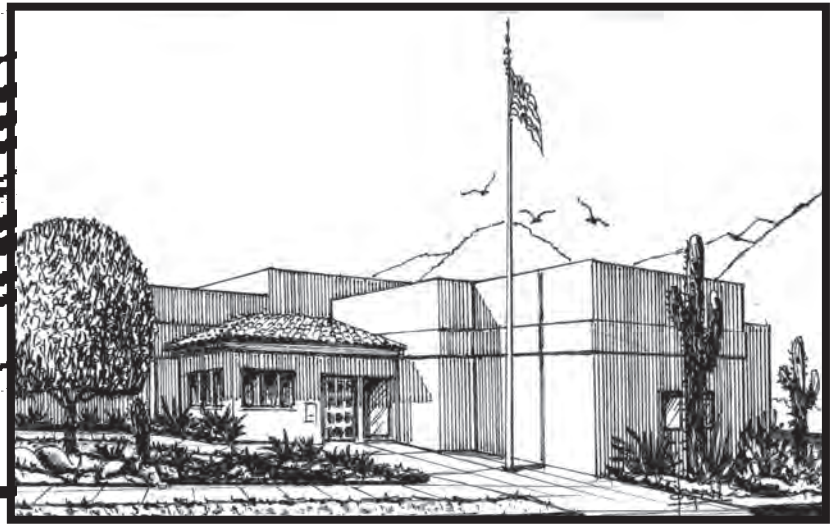

As our membership increases, so will potential donors so I'm confident that with help of new donors and our regulars we will continue to increase our number of units yearly.

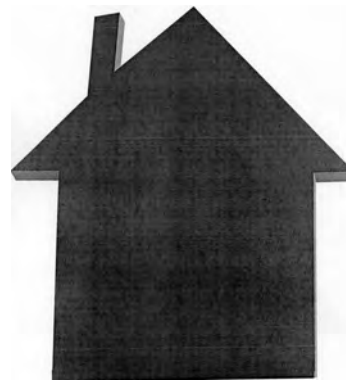

We set aside Memorial Day each and every year

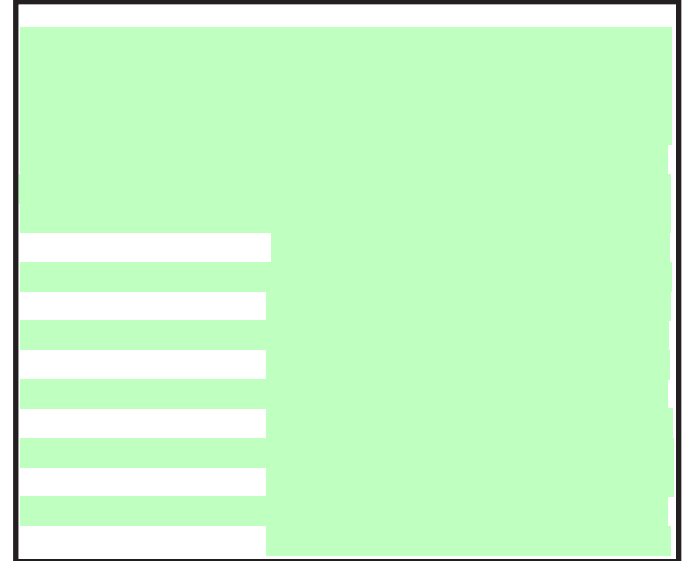
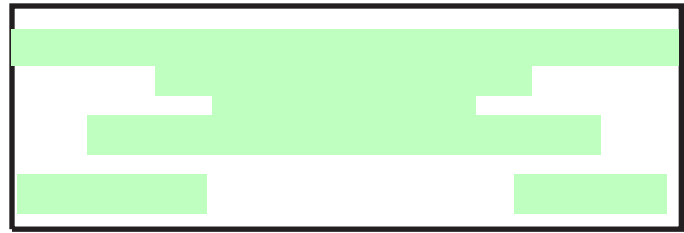
To honor those who gave their lives

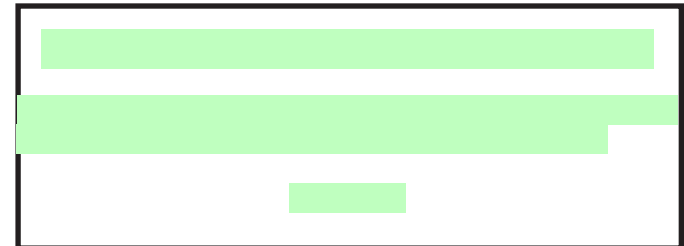


MERRY CHRISTMAS !!!!!

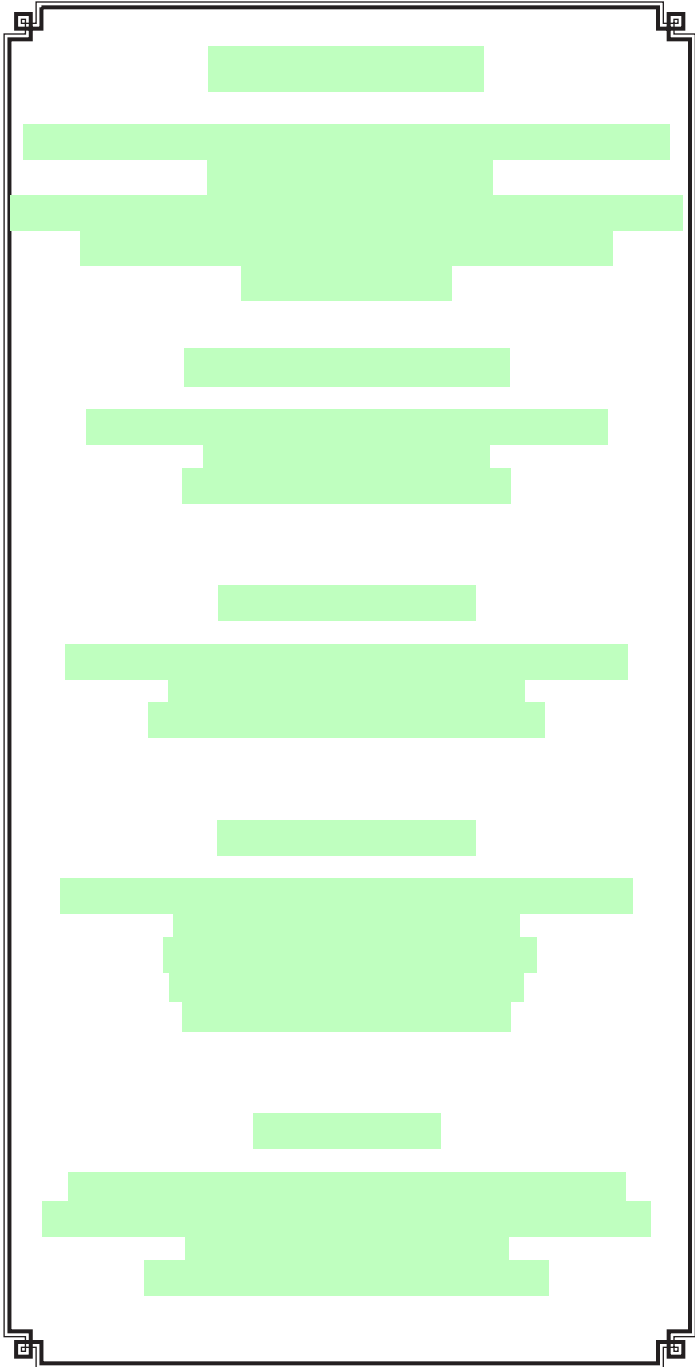

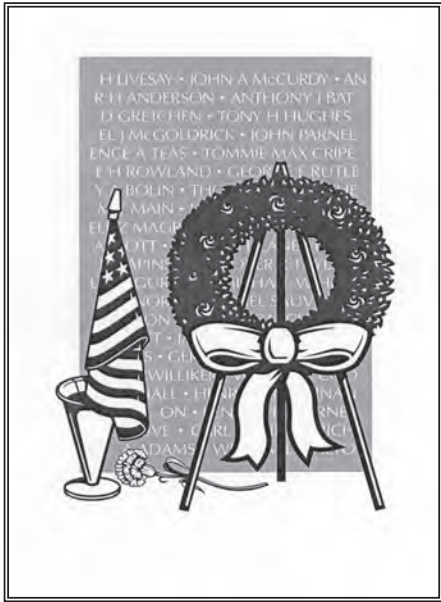
**SICKNESS AND DISTRESS**

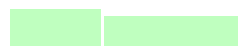
