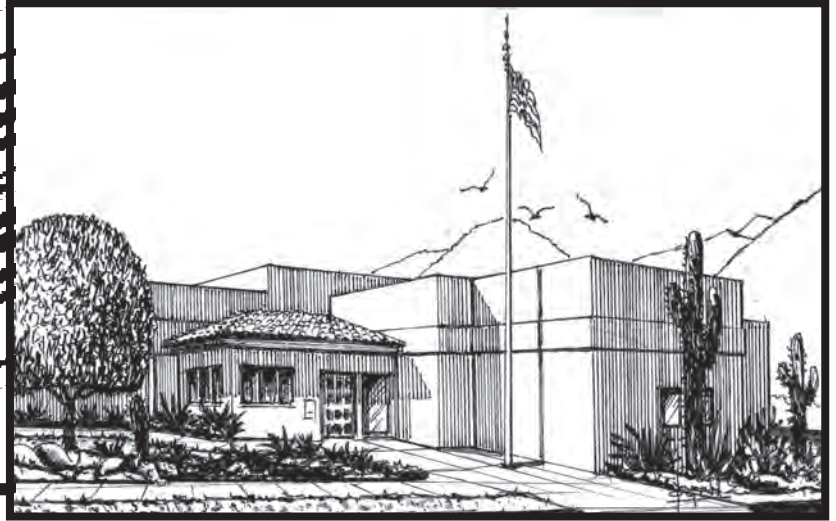

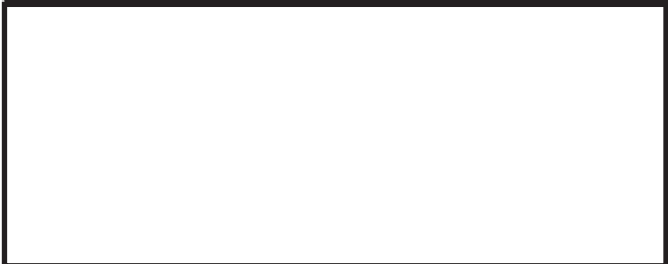
As you know I will be attending the University of Arizona in the fall, majoring in Architecture. I would love to keep in touch to let you know how your investment impacts my educational experience and beyond.

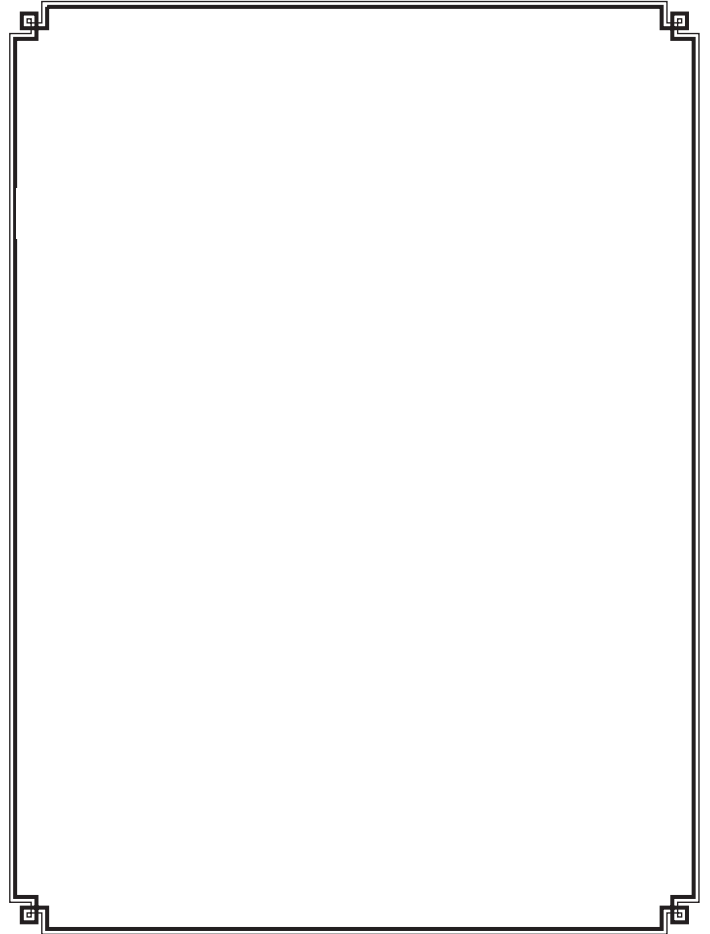
SICKNESS AND DISTRESS
